

California Pioneer and Noted Lawyer Is Summoned.

Served With Ability in Positions of Public Trust.

SACRAMENTO, Nov. 5.—Judge Amos P. Catlin, one of the most prominent lawyers of Northern California, died at his home in this city today, aged 77 years. Amos Parmalee Catlin was born in Red Hook, Dutchess County, N. Y., on Jan. 25, 1823, studied law in Kingston, Ulster County, and was admitted to the bar as an attorney at law and solicitor in Albany in January, 1844...
