

THE REPUBLICAN PARTY OF THE UNITED STATES AT MIDNIGHT

NOW GIVE VOTES TO MCKINLEY The Republicans Carry States Formerly for Bryan.

Significant Gains Are Made in Many Eastern and Western States.

GROUND LOST BY THE NEBRASKAN

Returns From Indiana, Michigan, the Two Dakotas, Utah and Wyoming Disquieting to Democrats.

NEW YORK, Nov. 7.—A 1 o'clock tabulation of the probable Electoral College, giving McKinley eight votes from Nebraska, thereby increasing his total to 302.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—It became evident at a very early hour this evening that the election of McKinley and Roosevelt was assured.

On the other hand, the returns from Indiana, Michigan, the two Dakotas, Utah and Wyoming, as well as Nebraska, indicate a large Republican gain over 1888.


ALABAMA. MONTGOMERY, Ala., Nov. 6.—Returns from the State are too meager to give any figures on vote for President.

ARKANSAS. LITTLE ROCK, Ark., Nov. 6.—At 11:20 to-night the returns show a slight falling off in the vote in the large counties, which may reduce Bryan's majority to 50,000.

COLORADO. DENVER, Nov. 6.—Returns received up to 11 o'clock indicate that Colorado has given Bryan at least 20,000 plurality.

ILLINOIS. CHICAGO, Nov. 6.—Chairman Rowe of the Republican State Central Committee gave out the following statement:

District, and it is believed that John P. Shafroth is re-elected in the First, but this cannot be said positively.

CONNECTICUT. NEW HAVEN, Conn., Nov. 7.—The plurality for McKinley is about 23,000. The surprise of the day was occasioned by the fact that the Republican State ticket followed closely the figures of the Presidential contest and was elected by pluralities of over 21,000.

DELAWARE. WILMINGTON, Del., Nov. 6.—Returns received up to 9:30 o'clock indicate a Republican majority in Newcastle County of 2000 to 2300.

FLORIDA. JACKSONVILLE, Fla., Nov. 6.—At midnight the result in Florida can be summarized as follows: Bryan's majority over McKinley, 22,000 Jennings (D.) for Governor, is elected by 21,000 majority. The State Legislature is unanimously Democratic.

GEORGIA. ATLANTA, Ga., Nov. 6.—Bryan's majority in Georgia will be about 40,000. The majority for Bryan shows an apparent increase over that of four years ago of about 40,000.

INDIANA. INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., Nov. 7.—A conservative estimate at 12:30 a. m. places McKinley's plurality in Indiana at 30,000. The entire Republican State ticket is elected.

IOWA. DES MOINES, Nov. 7.—It is apparent that Iowa is Republican by 100,000 and that a solid delegation of eleven Republicans will be sent to Washington.

KANSAS. KANSAS CITY, Nov. 7.—At 1 a. m. Chairman Albright of the Kansas Republican State Committee claims the State for McKinley by 20,000 plurality and for Stanley by 25,000.

KENTUCKY. LOUISVILLE, Nov. 6.—At 10 o'clock both Democratic and Republican committees claim the State, though they furnish no figures in support of their claims.

LOUISIANA. NEW ORLEANS, La., Nov. 6.—Returns received up to 11 o'clock indicate a Republican majority in the State of 100,000.

MASSACHUSETTS. BOSTON, Nov. 7.—The plurality in this city of 840 for Bryan in one precinct to be heard from, came as the surprise of the election in Massachusetts.

MICHIGAN. DETROIT, Nov. 6.—President McKinley has carried Michigan beyond doubt. Conservative estimates place his majority at 25,000.

MINNESOTA. ST. PAUL, Nov. 7.—Up to 2 o'clock 407 precincts of the cities and throughout the State had sent in reports on President.

MISSOURI. ST. LOUIS, Nov. 6.—Up to midnight the returns from the State and city were meager, owing to the operation of the new and untried Nesbitt election law.

NEBRASKA. OMAHA, Nov. 6.—At midnight 200 precincts out of 1011 in the State had returned results of to-day's election, thirty of them being from Omaha and Douglas County.

NEW YORK. TRENTON, Nov. 6.—Incomplete returns from different parts of the State indicate that New Jersey has been carried for McKinley by more than 50,000.

MARYLAND. BALTIMORE, Nov. 6.—McKinley has carried Maryland beyond the shadow of a doubt, the only question to be settled being the size of his majority.
