San Jose Rouser Brings Grief to Two Estimable Families.

WEDS A SIXTEEN-YEAR-OLD GIRL

Forsakes Her Three Weeks Later and Induces Another Young Miss to Elope With Him.

San Jose, Nov. 7.—A young husband's infidelity and unfaithfulness after three short weeks of married life was brought to light yesterday in Justice Wallace's court by the issuance of a warrant for Warren Hartzell's arrest on a charge of abduction. The complainant is B. F. McCormick, who accuses Hartzell of having kidnapped his wife, Miss Beatie Maud, away from home, for the purpose of forcing her into an immoral life. The girl, whose mother is dead, had been keeping house for her father.

Three weeks ago Hartzell, who is well known about the city, married Miss Beatie Showers, an estimable girl, only 16 years of age. They at once went to house-keeping and seemed happy. After the first week the young husband stayed away a great deal in the evenings, telling his wife that he was to come home on Sunday night. He failed to do so, and on inquiry showed that Miss Maud McCormick, a 16-year-old miss, also was missing. Then it was learned that Hartzell had spent a great deal of his time in the girl's company. Mrs. Hartzell is a very heartbroken over her husband's conduct.

McCormick is determined Hartzell shall be punished for the offense and looking for him. It is believed he took the girl to San Francisco, and from there to Los Angeles.

Hartzell was employed in a repair shop on San Carlos street. For some time he has been under police suspicion, and is accused of a number of thefts. An unusual effort will be made to capture him.

JAIL INMATES PERMITTED TO CAST BALLOTS

Three Men Under Duress Participate in Election at Fresno.

REGISTER WHILE IN THE PRISON

Compelled to Swear In Their Votes, They Give as Their Place of Abode the Cells They Occupy.

FRESNO, Nov. 7.—A sensation has been caused in this county by the knowledge that names of inmates of the County Jail were placed on the great register of Fresno County and that attempts in some cases successful, were made to vote them yesterday.

Those who voted, or attempted to vote, being registered at the County Jail, are, as far as known thus far, Dr. W. D. Smith, serving six months for practicing medicine without a license; Hamilton, convicted of vagrancy, who was a "trusty" and "Jack" Heath, who was detained as a witness and was being boarded at the county's expense.

"Jack" Heath gave his legal residence as the County Jail. Heath was not a prisoner there, yet he had never before been arrested. When Charles Ardell was arrested in Nebraska, Heath was an important witness and Deputy Sheriff White brought him to Fresno from Southern California. His vote was challenged and he swore it in.
