

HALF FARE FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN

The Ordinance Is Passed to Print by Board of Supervisors.

The ordinance providing for a 25-cent street-car fare for pupils of public and private schools under the age of 18 years was passed to print by the Board of Supervisors yesterday.

The ordinance provides that tickets for the transportation of pupils shall be sold in packages of twenty and shall be received on street railroads between the hours of 8 and 11 a. m., 12 and 1 p. m., 2:30 and 4 o'clock p. m., and 6:30 and 9:30 p. m. during the days in which schools are in session, and shall be available with such privileges of transfers as are enjoyed by other passengers.

The ordinance granting and transferring any rights, franchises, or privileges mentioned shall secure from the principal or head teacher of the school which it attends a certificate as to the actual attendance in actual attendance therein.

The Hay City Amateur Athletic Club was granted a license to hold a boxing exhibition during January on payment of the proper license tax.

The Board of Works was authorized to build a home for the City and County Hospital nurses at a site whereon to erect the San Francisco State Normal School, on condition that the building be constructed by the State within a reasonable time.

The ordinance extending the pound limits to the County line was defeated.

The Finance Committee was requested to investigate the advisability of providing funds in the next budget for the improvement of the park.


