WASHINGTON, Feb. 20.—After the preliminary opening exercises at today's session of the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution, a stir was created when Mrs. Nesbitt of Massachusetts presented a resolution to the effect that the statements recently circulated attacking the board of officers of the D. A. R., being untrue, libelous and reflecting upon the honor of the organization, should receive the disapproval of the society.

There were about 150 children present and many hundred delegates.

Kansas Prisoner Hurried Away Before Gathering of Lynchers.

Mrs. Carrie Nation Occupies a Cell in the Jail, but Displays No Alarm During Disturbance.

TOPEKA, Kans., Feb. 20.—The vigilance of the officers was all that saved "Stick" Slater from lynching by an infuriated mob to-night. He will yet be lynched if he can be found.

Slater attacked 17-year-old Lottie Gerberick Monday evening and was captured by Topeka officers the next day in Carbondale. The officers kept the fact of the capture quiet and placed Slater in the County Jail here.

This afternoon it became known that he was here and immediately the Santa Fe shophmen, headed by the father, George Gerberick, is one, decided that he should be lynched. They at once sent a committee to watch the jail, while they quietly arranged the details of the expected lynching.
