

THE SAN FRANCISCO JOCKEY CLUB ANNOUNCES ITS INTENTION OF HOLDING RACES AT THE TANFORAN TRACK—SAN MATEO COUNTY OFFICERS WILL PERMIT VIOLATION OF THE RACING LAW

THE San Francisco Jockey Club announced last night that it would hold races at Tanforan to-day and all preparations have been made in accordance with this intention.

As the racing season now in progress begins to show signs of age, several of the big Eastern stables are getting their belongings together for a change of headquarters.

The cycling season opened in earnest yesterday, all three local clubs holding big road races to prepare their men for the annual race in May.

The automobils took advantage of the beautiful weather yesterday and were out on highways and back. Three horseless carriages went over on the 9 o'clock creek boat to Oakland, the rendezvous camp at the store of the Locomobile Company, on Telegraph avenue.
