The California State Floral Society held its regular monthly meeting yesterday at the Japanese tea garden in Golden Gate Park.



BOYCOTT A BONE OF CONTENTION

Baseball Controversy Again Disturbs Labor Council Deliberations.

Boot and Shoe Workers' Union Is Taken to Task for Part Taken in Building Trades Attack.

A new phase of the fight against the baseball games developed in the San Francisco Labor Council last night. It appears that at the last meeting of the Boot and Shoe Workers' Union P. H. McCarthy and other members of the Building Trades Council put in an appearance, and despite the action of the parent body induced the union to declare a sub-cathedral boycott against the ball games in which Henry Harris has an interest.

George W. Reed was admitted as a delegate from the Pattern Makers' Union. One of the latest organizations, the Vinegar and Purveyors' Union, announced the names of Charles Buffin and William Murphy as delegates.

The Picture Frame Workers, after announcing that twenty-five men were out on strike, asked that a boycott be declared against Sanborn, Vase & Co. The Coopers' International Union also asked that a boycott be declared against the Francisco and Dupont streets.

The Stabblers' Union also wants a boycott on the Jacobs estate, on Jackson street, between Front and Battery.

Garment Workers' Union. Local Union 131 of the United Garment Workers of America held an enthusiastic meeting Thursday night and over 300 journeymen, apprentices and women garment workers signed the roll and were initiated.

Ship Clerks Organize. Eighty ship clerks met Wednesday night at 45 Steuart street and organized the Ship Clerks' Association.
