LONDON, April 18.—The exceptional interest taken in this year's budget statement was evidenced by the crowded condition of the House of Commons when it assembled yesterday.

BEER ESTIMATE TOO HIGH.

The Chancellor then proceeded to review the various items of revenue, mentioning that the revenue from beer was £4,900,000 less than the estimate.

"That decrease," said he, "is probably attributable to the fact that very many beer drinkers are in South Africa, and also to the decrease in the spending power of the people, owing to the high price of coal.

PROPOSING SUGAR AND COAL TAX.

Turning to the present year, the Chancellor of the Exchequer said that the total estimated expenditure was £187,000,000.
