City Smoke Pipe of Peace.

Happy Feature Marks Reunion of Pioneers in Glenbrook Park.

GRASS VALLEY, Sept. 10.—To-day witnessed the largest gathering of people Nevada County has seen in many years. A reunion of the pioneers of this county, and every old settler within a radius of fifty miles drove or rode or walked to Glenbrook Park, a pretty little retreat and picnic grounds midway between Grass Valley and Nevada City. The occasion was the dedication of the new electric railroad connecting these two mining cities, which was recently completed at an outlay of \$100,000. It is estimated that at least 4000 persons were in Glenbrook Park.

EUROPEAN RULERS BECOMING FEARFUL

Twenty-five troops of cavalry will be employed in France to protect the routes taken by Emperor Nicholas. The French, Swiss and Italian governments have ordered their police to exercise the greatest vigilance on the frontiers in the expectation that frightened anarchists will seek refuge in flight.

BOSTON'S BARBER REGULATIONS

Board of Health Orders Sterilization of All That Barbers Use on Customers.

A special dispatch from Boston, May 5, 1900, to the New York Sun gives as new regulations of the Boston Board of Health as to barber shops: "Mugs, shaving brushes and razors shall be sterilized after each separate use thereof. A separate, clean towel shall be used for each person. Material to stop the flow of blood shall be used only in powdered form and applied to a towel. Powder puff prohibited." Wherever new shops are established, it is antiseptic and kills the dandruff germ.
