


SHIP SEA WITCH ARRIVES IN TOW OF THE RED STACK TUG SEA QUEEN

She Was on Fire in Manila Bay and Later Went to Hongkong for Repairs, but Now Comes to San Francisco for an Overhauling---Mail Company's Steamship City of Peking Sails for Ports of the Orient via Honolulu

THE British ship Sea Witch arrived from Hongkong yesterday in tow of the tug Sea Queen. She made the run in fifty-nine days and had an uneventful passage. The vessel was on fire in the harbor of Manila nearly a year ago. She was badly damaged and went to Hongkong for repairs. She was not overhauled there but came here in ballast and will be extensively fixed up before accepting a grain cargo for Europe.
