TUCSON, Ariz., Nov. 12.—The haciendas about Guaymas, which have been in a constant state of terror for the past month, are now thoroughly alarmed and the population is fleeing to the city for protection.

At Santa Maria, a military post, General Torres was reinforced and the cavalry and the infantry, forming a column, entered in running of large numbers of horses from ranches in the valley.

When news of his death reached the widow of Don Palmas she immediately mounted her horse and went after the body of her husband, accompanied by vaqueros.

ACCUSATION OF FRAUD AGAINST AN ATTORNEY Suit Brought to Set Aside Mortgage Held by William A. Bowden of San Jose.

SAN JOSE, Nov. 12.—Charles Newman and his wife to-day began suit against William A. Bowden, a prominent attorney of this city, to have a mortgage against their property set aside, alleging that it was obtained by misrepresentation.

Newman claims that Bowden took advantage of his ignorance of the English language to deceive him. Although the mortgage calls for interest at 10 per cent per annum, Newman has been made upon him in the two years interest.
