Many Witnesses Swear That Mrs. Kilbourne Was Sober.

Defense to Have Its First Inning Monday, After Price Is Heard.

The trial of Frank Morrissey and Martin Flynn on charges of assaulting and robbing Mrs. Rose Kilbourne on the night of December 15 is drawing to a close.

The attention of the prosecution was devoted yesterday largely to corroborating the features of Mrs. Kilbourne's testimony concerning events following the alleged attack upon her, and much cumulative evidence was adduced to show that she was not intoxicated at the time of the assault and robbery.

The defense will try to show that Mrs. Kilbourne was under the influence of liquor and that she lost her hat and jewelry and tore her clothing in her fall while crossing the vacant lot near the Morrissey home, and also to show malice against the Morrisseys on the part of at least one important witness for the people.

Discrepancies Explained. Williams said in answer to a question that Mrs. Kilbourne appeared as a person recovering from a period of intoxication.

Patrolman Wollweber completed his testimony at the morning session. It added nothing that was new to the case.
