Colombian Troops Being Sent to Bocas del Toro.

Governor Is Surprised Because Gunboat Machias Did Not Seize Launches.

COLON, April 17.—Governor Salazar, who is still at Colon, considers the situation at Bocas del Toro to be serious. He is sending hence additional reinforcements and is doing his utmost to prevent the loss from falling into the hands of the Liberals.

The Governor expressed surprise at the report that the commander of the United States gunboat Machias, Lieutenant Commander McCrea, had not insisted upon the immediate surrender of the launches, barges, etc., belonging to the United Fruit Company, an American concern, especially in view of the fact that the matter directly affects Colombia, inasmuch as the launches were to be located at Boca del Toro.

The Machias has not yet returned to Colon.
