



BE LA MAR FEELS GAP OF FLEETS

Men Are Injured in a Fire in Mining Town Destroys Fifteen Buildings.

REDDING, July 9.—De la Mar, the mining town near Bully Hill, was swept by fire to-night. The blaze started at 11:30 o'clock, and within an hour had destroyed fifteen business houses. The Bully Hill miners turned out in force and their hard work saved the rest of the town. The loss is placed at about \$20,000. The names of the losers could not be obtained to-night.

The fire was caused by the explosion of a kerosene lamp in a saloon located in the corner of the main street. From the saloon the flames rapidly spread, soon enveloping the entire block. Some of the buildings were so badly damaged that it is probable that the burned structures will be quickly rebuilt, modern buildings replacing the frame ones that were destroyed.
