His daughter Clara is the wife of Rear Admiral Wedgell, retired, of the United States navy.

At the funeral were Colonel D. Childer, Colonel A. S. Hubbard, Colonel Sheldon I. Kellogg, J. W. Farrington, representing the Sons of the American Revolution.
