Is Wanted in China Port on a Charge of Embezzlement.

When the steamer Hongkong Maru arrived from Honolulu yesterday Detective Freil went out to meet her in the customs launch. He had with him a description of R. P. Moffitt, alias Murphy, who was wanted in Hongkong on a charge of embezzling \$2000. He soon picked out his man from among the passengers and placed him under arrest. He was traveling under the name of J. R. Murphy. His wife was with him.

Moffitt was taken to the City Prison and placed in "the tanks" pending further developments. He at once employed Attorney Peter F. Dunne to secure his release on a writ of habeas corpus, and action to accomplish that end will probably be taken to-day.


