


DOCTORS TINK 'T WAS ACCIDENT Medical Men Agree in the Mrs. Ellen Gore Case. Paris Tragedy Will Not Cause International Complications.

PARIS, Nov. 25.—In spite of the rigid secrecy which has been maintained by the officials and by the commission of American doctors concerning the result of the autopsy on the body of Mrs. Ellen Gore, it is learned from authoritative sources that the doctors tend almost unanimously to the acceptance of the theory of an accident, and it is certain that their official report will incline to that theory. The doctors do not positively assert it, this bringing the French and American doctors into agreement and relieving the case of any international significance.
