MARRIED LIFE DISGUSTS HIM Contractor Vezina Sues for Severance of Irksome Bonds.

Louis N. Vezina, a contractor and builder, is disgusted with married life as he has found it, and he wants a divorce. Yesterday he filed a suit against Lauretta Vezina, in which he charges that since November, 1898, when she became his wife, she has made his life miserable by her actions. She is a cruel wife, he alleges, and he wants relief because her treatment of him has made him a physical wreck.

Vezina charges that his wife has a villainous temper, and that she frequently indulges in liquid refreshments of the variety that make of her a veritable demon when under their influence. She curses him, he says, and beats him, using as weapons stove-lifters and firewood and occasionally hurls at his devoted head pots and pans containing mixtures originally intended for his breakfast, lunch or dinner.

Vezina makes particular mention of an occasion when, he alleges, his wife deluged him with a stew, which she had prepared for his dinner. He also charges that several times she locked him out, and threw his clothes into the street. The Vezinas live at 232 Eddy street. They have one child, for the custody of whom the plaintiff asks.

Laura M. Selbert is also disgusted with married life. In a complaint filed by her against Daniel J. Selbert, proprietor of a Pacific-street saloon, she charges him with cruelty. She says that a short time ago he gave her a beating because "she did not cook like his mother." She asks for a divorce, the custody of their two children and sufficient monthly alimony for her own and their maintenance. The Selberts were married in December, 1898.

Suits for divorce were also filed by Constantine Maschio against Clara Maschio and Louise Michi against Joseph Michi. Maschio charges desertion and Mrs. Michi failure to provide.

Interlocutory decrees of divorce were granted to Irene Chester from Theodore Chester for desertion, Samuel Zierer from Euseb Zierer for cruelty and Augusta Young from Henry P. Young for desertion.

Neglect Their Children. Mike Harmon, a saloon-keeper at 918 Howard street, and his wife Mary were arrested yesterday by Policeman McMurray of the California Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children on the charge of failure to provide for their three children, the oldest 6 years of age and the youngest four months. Harmon had to appear before the Police Commissioners some time ago on McMurray's complaint to show cause why his license should not be taken from him for allowing his children to spend most of their time in the saloon and not caring for them properly, and he agreed to rent a house at Mary and Natoma streets so that they would be away from the saloon. He did so, but McMurray says the children are as much neglected as before.
