Special Dispatch to The Call. STANFORD UNIVERSITY, June 20.—The extensive additions now in progress on the Stanford Museum, when completed, will make of it the largest and most elaborate private museum in existence. Buildings are being erected which will double the size and space of the original structure. Construction is being hurried as rapidly as possible, and according to present plans the museum will stand finished inside of two years' time.

Barbers to Test a State Law. SPOKANE, June 20.—The new State law requiring barber shops to close all day Sunday is to be tested in the courts. Al H. Lynn, manager of the Hotel Spokane barber shop, was arrested today on complaint of ex-Prosecutor Olin, the Barbers' Union for keeping his shop open on Sunday. The claim is made that the shop is a part of the hotel business and that the statute allowing hotels to keep open justifies this course.

Sheriff Goes After Alleged Murderer. SAN DIEGO, June 20.—Sheriff Braden left on the afternoon train today for San Bernardino to bring back Raphael Lopez, the alleged murderer of Constable Peter Burke in the Picochito riot two months ago. The Sheriff is accompanied by Constable Martin Picochito, who is well acquainted with Lopez. A reward of \$200 was offered for the apprehension of Lopez.

Senator Clark's Sister Is Engaged. LOS ANGELES, June 20.—The engagement is announced of Miss Ella Clark of this city, sister of United States Senator W. A. Clark of Montana, and Rev. J. M. Newell, pastor of the Bethesda Presbyterian Church of this city. Rev. Newell was for many years pastor of the Santa Clara Presbyterian Church. The wedding will probably take place within a few months.

Improves Its Block Signal System. BAKERSFIELD, June 20.—The Southern Pacific Company is improving its block signal system and is putting in distance signals near different stations along the road in order to secure safer approaching trains. The company has contemplated the placing of the electric block system in Slocard Canyon, between Vincent Hill and Los Angeles.

Steamer Arrives From the Yukon. VANCOUVER, B. C., June 20.—The Steamer Princess May arrived today with a hundred passengers, being the first to come out since navigation opened on the Yukon this spring. The steamer Humboldt is on her way to Seattle with about sixty more passengers, and between them the two vessels have about half a million dollars in gold dust and drafts.

Killed by a Passenger Train. LOS ANGELES, June 20.—Peter Pallandrea, an Italian, was struck by an incoming Santa Fe passenger train at Aliso street today and killed. The man was thrown from the train and before the accident could be averted was hurled high in the air by the engine. When he was picked up he was dead.

Danger of a Serious Flood Is Over. PORTLAND, Ore., June 20.—The river here is at a normal stage and the flood danger is expected to fall tomorrow. The upper Columbia is falling and all danger of a serious flood has passed.

Cruiser Protet Reaches San Diego. SAN DIEGO, June 20.—The French cruiser Protet reached here this forenoon, having come from Acapulco. All well on board.
