"You ask me if I think war is inevitable. I can only say that Japan is awaiting the arrival of the Russian reply to her last note.



Gunboat Bennington and Destroyers Preble and Paul Jones Start for Panama.

MORE DUTIES FOR CORTELYOU

President Declares Jurisdiction Over All the Hawaiian Lighthouses and Public Land

IN EFFECT ON JANUARY 1

Secretary of Commerce and Labor Notifies Honolulu of the Change as Ordered

WASHINGTON, Dec. 30.—By proclamation dated December 28, 1903, President Roosevelt directed that all public property of the former Government of Hawaii ceded heretofore to the United States and consisting of lighthouses and public lands used in connection therewith, light vessels, lighthouse tenders, beacons, buoys, sea marks and their appendages and supplies and materials of all kinds provided therefor, be taken for the use of the United States and that the Department of Commerce and Labor, through the Lighthouse Board, be charged with all administrative duties relating to the Hawaiian lighthouse establishment.

Secretary Cortelyou at once called the President's proclamation to the Governor of Hawaii and informed him that the Federal Government would assume charge of the Hawaiian lighthouse establishment on January 1, 1904.

As a modus vivendi the Secretary of Commerce and Labor, authorized the Governor to maintain the Hawaiian lighthouse service at the expense of the Federal Government, promising to reimburse him, immediately thereafter through the Lighthouse Board.

The present Hawaiian lighthouse-keepers are all taken over into the United States Lighthouse Service, which will pay them for their services from and after January 1.

The Lighthouse Board will, at its session of January 4, 1904, by formal action, make the Territory of Hawaii a part of the Twelfth Lighthouse District.

An officer of the United States navy will be detailed as assistant to the inspector of the Twelfth Lighthouse District, to reside at Honolulu and act under the orders of the inspector of the Twelfth District.

The Secretary of War has been instructed to detail an officer of the corps of engineers, U. S. A., for assignment to duty as assistant to the inspector of the Twelfth Lighthouse District, whose headquarters is at San Francisco, with directions to take station at Honolulu with instructions to take care of the construction and repair of lighthouses and lighthouse buildings. The Territorial Government was without funds to continue the lighthouse service of the islands after January 1, 1904, and the interests of commerce and navigation required that the Federal Government should provide for their maintenance from and after that date.

The President, by executive order of December 24 also directed that the Department of Commerce and Labor take charge of the lighthouse and buoyage within the limits of the naval reservation at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.

OF INTEREST TO PEOPLE OF THE PACIFIC COAST

Fourth class postmasters appointed: California—Lemon Grove, San Diego County, John C. Braidon, vice Curtis E. Metcalf, resigned; Poway, San Diego County, C. C. Watson, vice Annie E. Smith, resigned.

Army orders: Captain John S. Kulp, assistant surgeon, from Fort McDowell, California, to Philadelphia, as examiner of recruits.

Splendid Donation to Santa Fe. WASHINGTON, Dec. 30.—Secretary Hitchcock, with the consent of the President, to-day agreed to donate to Santa Fe, N. M., the abandoned Fort Marcy military reservation, a tract of 17 1/2 acres. The tract lies in the heart of Santa Fe and is said to be worth \$100,000. It will be used as sites for a new high school and also a graded school.

Boston, Dec. 30.—The will of the late Peter B. Brigham of Boston, who left \$5,000,000 toward founding a hospital to bear his name, is sustained by a decision handed down by Justice Colver in the United States Court to-day. The heirs-in-law contested the bequest.
