
The steamer Enterprise sailed on Sunday for Hilo with a general merchandise cargo, valued at \$58,943 and including the following:

Barkentine Which Sailed Saturday for Nome Comes Back With Her Seams Badly Started and Water Pouring in Through Openings Faster Than It Can Be Pumped Out
