

FRANK SCORES HIS MOTHER-IN-LAW

Oakland Florist Says His Happy Home Was Wrecked by Mrs. Augusta Holland

SEEKS AID OF POLICE

Takes Son From His Wife as She Is Preparing to Leave City for St. Louis

Theodore Frank, pursued by his young wife Alfreida and his mother-in-law, Mrs. August Holland, of 459 Geary street, rushed into the Central Police Station yesterday morning carrying his two-year-old son in his arms.

He complained to Sergeant Moffitt that his wife and mother-in-law were to leave yesterday morning for St. Louis, taking the boy with them. He had gone to his mother-in-law's rooms at 459 Geary street, where his wife was living, and had taken possession of the boy.

Mrs. Frank and Mrs. Holland assured the sergeant that they were simply going to St. Louis on a visit and intended to return, after which a suit for divorce would be instituted and the custody of the child determined.

The sergeant told them that he could not interfere as the father had a right to have possession of his child.

Mrs. Frank demanded the return of the child, but Frank refused to part with him, and the mother-in-law insisted that she should go to Attorney Lunderback's office and have the question of possession settled.

"This woman," said Frank, pointing to his mother-in-law, "has been the cause of all our troubles. I was married to her daughter more than three years ago. At that time I was a florist on Telegraph avenue, Oakland, and for a few months we lived happily together. Then came the mother-in-law and discord. Two weeks before the child's birth she compelled my wife to leave my home and we have not lived together since. She has threatened that she would die if she had wrecked me and had seen me behind the bars of San Quentin. I sold out my business about two years ago and have made every effort to get my wife to return to me but all in vain."

Mrs. Holland denied that she had done anything wrong. She accused Frank of neglecting to support his wife properly and said that was why she had advised her daughter to live with her.

By the time they had finished their explanations the train for the East had started and they left the station with the intention of going to Attorney Lunderback's office. Frank retained possession of the child.

Divorces were granted by Judge Graham to Katherine Jackson from Benjamin F. Jackson, failure to provide; by Judge Troutt to Maud M. Owens from Elmer C. Owens, extreme cruelty, \$30 a month alimony given; by Judge Kerrigan to Alice C. Lundberg from Charles R. Lundberg, failure to provide.

Dina Smith sued her husband, Andrew S. Smith, for divorce on the ground of cruelty and neglect. She says that he owns a livery stable at 308 Seventh street, which is worth \$3000, and is earning a \$300 a month. She asks for \$100 a month alimony and the custody of their infant child.

ANTI-FOOT-BINDING SOCIETY'S GOOD WORK

Mrs. Fryer, Former Missionary, Explains Results of Association's Labors in China.

One of the many interesting addresses delivered last week at the bi-annual meeting of the Bay Missionary Alliance of the Methodist Episcopal church South was an account by Mrs. Fryer, former missionary to China, on the progress of the work done by the "Anti-Foot-Binding Society."

The meeting was held in the chapel of the theological seminary, Berkeley, and was well attended.

Mrs. Fryer explained the crusade against the "foot-binding" custom and told of the happy results that followed the efforts of the society.
