WILL CARRY COTTON CARGOES TO MANCHESTER

British Steamer Lines Will Fight for a Portion of the Trade From New Orleans. LONDON, Oct. 6.—Manchester's fight for a diversion of a portion of Liverpool's cotton trade from America has resulted, according to statements published to-day, in an arrangement with the Leyland line and the Manchester lines, limited, of Manchester, whereby the two companies will combine for the purpose of carrying cotton cargoes direct from New Orleans to Manchester.

The railroad traffic is uninterrupted and additional soldiers continue to arrive.

LONDON, Oct. 6.—The remains of Sir William Vernon Harcourt, who died on Saturday, were buried in the family vault at Newnham, Oxford, to-day, with the utmost simplicity and privacy. Only the family and tenantry were present.

Antarctic Relief Ship Arrives

PLYMOUTH, Oct. 6.—The Antarctic relief ship Morning Star arrived here to-day and subsequently proceeded to Sheerness. The steamer Morning Star was chartered by the Royal Geographical Society in 1902 and went, in company with the steamer Terra Nova, to the relief of the British ship Discovery.
