

SIBERIA REACHES EXPECTED LINE BRINGS MANY PASSENGERS AND VERY VALUABLE CARGO. TRANSPORT DIX IS IN FROM MANILA

The Pacific Mail Company's liner Siberia, Captain J. Tremaine Smith, arrived yesterday from the Orient two days ahead of her schedule and several hours before she was expected.

The big liner had great difficulty getting alongside the Pacific Mail wharf. The tide was ebbing and the strong southerly wind did all it could to blow her away from her berth.

Among the passengers was Louis Eppinger, one of the best known hoteliers in the Orient. Dr. Gates, surgeon-george E. Chapin, purser Alexander Morphy, freight clerk, and G. Thompson, chief steward of the liner Gaelic, returned on the Siberia.

The Siberia was in fine weather all the way across the Pacific. She came into port looking as clean and trim as when she went away. She brought 414 tons of freight, which included 725 bales of raw silk. She brought 416 passengers, of whom about 300 were Asiatics.
