San Francisco has violated all underwriting traditions and precedent by not burning up. That it has not done so is largely due to the vigilance of the fire department, which cannot be relied upon indefinitely to stave off the consequences.

SAYS CITY HAS VIOLATED ALL OF THE TRADITIONS OF BUSINESS BY NOT BURNING UP
