Sweeping Investigation of the Isthmian Government.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 9.—All matters relating to the Panama canal and the government of the Panama Railroad will be investigated by the Senate Committee on Interoceanic Canals. This was decided today at the first meeting of the committee. The investigation will be begun on Tuesday next, although there may be a special meeting in the interim to take up the nominations of Canal Commissioners.

When the committee was called to order there were present Senators Millard, chairman; Kittredge, Hopkins, Knox, Morgan, Taliaferro and Gorman. The nominations of commissioners were taken up, but on account of the number of absentees and the fact that it had been intimated that it might be desired to have hearings in regard to one or more of them, they were laid over for the present. The formulation of a programme in regard to canal affairs was then considered. All members of the committee agreed that there should be an inquiry, and the scope of the investigation was considered at length. There seemed to be a sentiment in favor of reviewing the work of the Canal Commission from its inception. Senator Gorman drafted a resolution for introduction in the Senate by Chairman Millard, giving the committee authority to engage in such an inquiry.

"INSURGENTS" WORLD CAUCUS PHILIPPINE BILL HAS A BAD DAY

Anti-Administration Republicans of House Confident of Defeating Statehood

BILL TO BE SHELVED

Speaker Cannon Realizes That Opposition Is Too Strong at Present Time

WASHINGTON, Jan. 9.—Speaker Cannon's efforts to win the insurgents over to the Hamilton joint statehood bill have met with little success. Apparently, and the joint statehood proposition is still shrouded in uncertainty. The insurgents claim they have more than fifty-eight votes, the number which, coupled with the solid Democratic vote, will force consideration of amendments to the Hamilton bill. Two or three Republicans are reported to have been won over to the administration measure, through Speaker Cannon, but the weakening in the opposition is so slight that until further changes are brought about the Hamilton bill will not be taken before the House.

The Republican insurgents held a statehood caucus to-day, which was attended by about twenty-five Representatives. A poll of the House on the joint statehood proposition by the insurgents was reported at the caucus to have shown slightly less than seventy-five Representatives who would vote in favor of a proposed rule preventing amendment of the Hamilton bill. The insurgents are confident they will retain enough of these votes to make it possible for them, with the Democrats, to defeat the proposed rule.

PANAMA CONFRONTED WITH INDIAN REVOLT

Tribesmen Decide to Transfer Their Allegiance to Colombia.

PANAMA, Jan. 9.—Captain Lovelace of the Panama gunboat Oriente yesterday brought a letter to President Amador, written by Innanaquina, grand chief of the San Blas Indians on the lower Atlantic coast of Panama, announcing their secession from Panama and the renewal of their allegiance to Colombia. There are about thirty thousand of these Indians along 110 miles of the coast of Panama and the Colombian flag is being displayed.

This revolt against Panama's rule is said to have been fomented by Colombians, and as these Indians have never been conquered or subjected to the matter of bringing them back under this country's flag, unless accomplished diplomatically, may prove serious. No announcement has yet been made of Panama's intended course, but the matter was discussed last night.

Among the reasons given for the secession are said to be the promises made by Huertas, a former general of the Panama army, which have not been fulfilled.

MILD "REPRIMAND" FOR LUCIEN YOUNG

Private Letter Sent Him by the Secretary of the Navy.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 9.—Before his departure for Christchurch, Secretary of the Navy Taft wrote a letter of reprimand to Commander Lucien Young, in execution of the sentence of the court-martial which found that officer guilty of remissness of duty in connection with the explosion on the gunboat Bennington.

HAZING GIVEN WIDE SCOPE BY THE COURT

ANNAPOLIS, Jan. 9.—Several legal questions of importance arose to-day during the second trial of Midshipman Stephen Decatur on charges of hazing before the court-martial in session at the Naval Academy. The court decided that the act of 1903, which provides dismissal for "encouraging or countenancing hazing" is amendatory of the act of 1874, which provides the penalty for active participation in hazing.

ARMY AND NAVY ORDERS

WASHINGTON, Jan. 9.—Army orders: Major Hugh J. Gallagher, commissary, is relieved of duty with the Isthmian Canal Commission, and will report for duty in the subsistence department of the Philippines division. Navy orders: Lieutenant E. P. Jessop is detached from the Union Iron Works at San Francisco to duty as assistant inspector of machinery for the Milwaukee building at said works, with a view to duty as senior officer of that vessel when commissioned.

Schooner Ashore Near Cape Henry. CAPE HENRY, Va., Jan. 9.—The schooner Fannie Palmer went ashore the quarters of a mile north of Little Island Life-saving station at 4 o'clock this morning. The vessel is lying near the beach and pounding heavily. One man was landed in a breeches buoy with a message to the owner. Others of the crew refused to land.

CLASH IN MINORITY

Burgess of Texas Has Tilt With Williams, the Leader of the Democratic Forces

WASHINGTON, Jan. 9.—The Philippine tariff measure was the single topic of discussion in the House to-day. The speeches were uniformly against the measure and were allowed to go, in general, without answer. Digression in the form of tariff revision discussion was made in a brief speech by Gillett of Massachusetts, who favored Canadian reciprocity. Burgess of Texas opposed the bill on constitutional grounds and had a lively colloquy with Minority Leader Williams on this point. He charged that Democrats be consistent should oppose anything but free trade with the Philippines on the ground that it was an American possession.

Williams defended the minority position by stating that he was supporting the bill because it was as near free trade as it was possible to obtain from the majority and furnished the interesting situation of the day.

Cassell of Pennsylvania spoke in opposition to the bill. Henry of Connecticut took the same position. Goulden of New York closed the debate for the day with a brief reference to the need of taking the protection of the Dingley rates from the "giant trusts" of the country.

Burgess regarded any tariff between the United States and the Philippines as unconstitutional and said he should vote against the bill. He suggested that if the Democrats did not believe in the tariff schedules were sacred, but contented himself in abiding by the action of the Republican majority. Answering a question by Sullivan, he said he should favor free trade with Canada. In order that cordiality might be developed in that direction, he favored Canadian reciprocity.

"The gentleman stands exactly on the Democratic platform," asserted Sullivan. Gillett admitted frankly that he should follow the action of the Republican majority in the House on the tariff. The contract was annulled because of the inability of the contractor to proceed with the work by reason of litigation instituted against him by private parties who desire to prevent the Government from diverting the waters of Lake Tahoe.

MORE TROOPS MAY BE SENT
Special Dispatch to The Call.
WASHINGTON, Jan. 9.—Alarming advice of unsettled and unsatisfactory conditions in China continue to reach the Department of State. The administration appears to be greatly disturbed over the prospect of an outbreak in China which will endanger the lives and property of American citizens and necessitate the landing of American troops. Department officials decline to give any details and refuse to say from what sources their information is derived. The information received by the United States Government is directly in contradiction of that furnished by the Chinese legation. It was said by Sir Chenung, the Chinese Minister, that there was no ground for fear of an outbreak in his country.
Secretary Taft some days ago ordered two regiments of infantry and two batteries of light field artillery to the Philippines, and directed the establishment of two brigade posts, in order to have troops near China, when trouble begins. While no official announcements have been made, it is believed that the alarm of the administration will be used as a basis for sending four more regiments to the Philippines, so as to have brigades that can be sent to China when they are needed.
When Secretary Taft was questioned to-day regarding statements made by some members of the diplomatic corps to the effect that the number of troops in Manila is being increased because of the disturbed conditions in the archipelago, and not owing to the situation in China, he said:

LOUIS JAMES' "VIRGINIUS" IS POWERFUL

I think every one enjoyed "Virgilius" last night, those new to the play and those that came to see it with a McCullough Virgilius as the last of their acquaintance. Louis James brings this one, the first of many years, to the Columbia this week. A good company plays it in the vein best suited to its robust artificiality, and the result is curiously pleasing. One found the ear unexpectedly tickled by the measured-stilted, if you like—periods. One found the eye curiously flattered by the grandiloquent stride, a heroic pose—"chesty" they call it at the Central. You liked this passion torn to tatters, and Mr. James was best when he had both feet on the loud pad. You liked even the "mob," most palpably, gloriously, a theater mob, drilled to go off like Mr. Sousa's orchestra. Its leader was something of a shock. He is so distinctly to-day—might have been picked up haranguing at Grant avenue and Market street. But he was all of the modernity of the production, the rest most soothingly in key.
Mr. James, as few of the actors of the day, has the amplitude of gesture, the heroic elocution, successfully to enact the character of Virgilius. And Mr. James wears a toga as if he had nothing else in his wardrobe. His voice is as fine as ever, and he simply reveals—not to say wallows—in Knowles' grandiose lines. He was heartily applauded all through the play, his best scenes perhaps the earlier moments of the Forum scene.
