

HAS ENOUGH EVIDENCE TO PROVE GUILTY

Schooner Ensign Runs into Series of Gales. Heavy Storms Throw Ship on Beam Ends. Reaches Port With Lumber Cargo Intact.

The schooner Ensign, which arrived yesterday, had a great battle with the sea and waves on her trip from Puget Sound to this port. Her commander, Captain Asplund, at times during the trip thought that the terrible weather they encountered would send vessel, crew and all to the bottom of the ocean.

The Ensign left Mukilteo on February 10, when she was in latitude 41-28 N. and longitude 127-58 W. She ran into a light southerly wind and heavy cross seas which carried away her foremast and 70 stow. She had barely got righted up and over this encounter with the elements when she ran into a storm that came near sending her to the lockers of Davy Jones. It was early in the morning of February 13, when in latitude 39-05 north and longitude 126-31 west she was struck by heavy southeast gales, which threw her on her beam ends, where she lay all the morn'g of wind and wave for over eight hours. She finally managed to right. During the storm her foremast was blown away. She brought \$50,000 feet of lumber to Charles R. McCormick.

Tris to Desert. The chief foreman of the Nippon Maru, a Japanese, leaped overboard from the deck of the steamer early yesterday morning and attempted to swim ashore. He struck around the end of the wharf and finally landed alongside the Arals, where he was pulled on board that day by one of the crew, where he was kept in an exhausted condition. He was later discovered by the vigilant eye of Captain Anderson and taken back to the Nippon Maru. The ship is expected to leave for Seattle on the steamer from the Orient, but hoped to make his escape and stay in San Francisco.

Barkentine Archer Arrives. The barkentine Archer, Captain Lancaster, arrived yesterday, 15 days from Honolulu. She brings 24,122 bags of sugar to Welch & Co. On February 6, when 100 miles northeast from Honolulu, she spoke the bark Kauihau.

Reaches Honolulu. The transport Buford arrived at Honolulu yesterday from the Philippines. She will probably sail for this port today.

PARADE WILL BE ABANDONED

Regulars and Militia Will Not "Hike" With Cadets on Washington's Birthday

YOUTHS TO WALK ALONE Embryo Warriors Who Tried to Organize Celebration Plan Lone Demonstration

The Washington's birthday parade is off. The tread martial will not dent the bitumen along Market street when the natal day of the father of his country dawns. The regular army men will not have the annual chance to criticize the National Guard, nor will the guardsmen have the yearly opportunity to feel abashed at themselves.

The First Corps of California Cadets, an organization which has newly sprung into existence and which has grown enough in its uniforms for several regiments, will hike along Market street alone. They tried to waken the municipality into enthusiasm over Washington's anniversary, but the city was apoplectic, they declare.

The fond parents of the youthful soldiers gave \$200, and the boys went to the Supervisors and obtained permission to organize a parade on condition that they did not go to the merchants for money. The cadet committee mapped out a line of march and sent out invitations to 300 organizations to parade.

Out of the 300 only one organization responded to the call of patriotism as issued by the cadets. The Spanish-American Legion, Brigadier General Koster ordered the guard to turn out, but countermanded the order. The League of the Cross Cadets, through Colonel Power, declined the invitation. Some of the others had to parade out of town, and the rest did not answer.

So the cadets will constitute the line of march and the whole street celebration by themselves. Out at the Presidio the regulars will be resting peacefully, and the guardsmen will be dispersing themselves at the picnics.

The three youths who were most prominent in agitating the idea of a parade are L. S. Ransdell, F. W. Roskamp and J. B. Wallick. The Signal Corps located in this city was inspected last Thursday and is now present except one, who was out of the State. The company, as in the past, made a very fine appearance and was perfect in appearance. Lack of floor room and distance did not give the men an opportunity to display their knowledge of signaling with flags and heliograph, but what they did do was to their credit.
