CLASSY TENNIS PLAY

Unusually Close Matches Seen in the Alameda County Championships

Allows Match With Foley to Be Postponed When Cramps Attack Latter

Many tennis matches were played in the Alameda County championship tournaments yesterday on the Golden Gate Park courts. Play was completed to the semi-finals in the doubles, while five players remain in the singles. In the doubles play was confined to the lower half. Only three matches were played, and two of them were too close-sided to be interesting. The third went the three sets, the contestants being C. Gardner and M. Long and M. Gabriel and M. McLoughlin. The latter two are the cleverest juveniles in the city, and they made a creditable showing against their older and more experienced opponents. N. Baker and H. Long disposed of R. Drolla and S. Gayness easily. The four teams in the semi-finals are Adams and Danlap, Lytton and Whitney, Gardner and M. Long and H. Long and N. Baker.

There were some unusually close and interesting matches in the singles. State Champion Adams and Bay Counties Champion Foley met in the semi-finals, and the two sets played were as good as any ever played on the public courts. After each had won a 7-5 set Foley was attacked by a severe cramp in the arm and was forced to retire temporarily. Adams showed his usual good sportsmanship by allowing the match to be postponed. It will be completed at his disabled opponent's pleasure. Adams seems to have regained his best form and many pick him to win the tournament. The entire match will be played over.

Another good match was that between Griffin and H. Long. All three sets went to 7-5, Griffin losing the first and winning the next two. The games were unusually long and the outcome was in doubt until the end.

Long had a close call in his match with young Gabriel. The latter won the first set and lost the next two to the narrowest of margins. This is the first time Gabriel has played his best game in a tournament. He will be hard to beat from now on.

N. Ambrose has been the surprise of the tournament. Although only a second-class player, he disposed of N. Baker last Sunday and made an excellent showing yesterday against Carl Gardner. The latter won two sets out of three, but had his hands full to do so.

THE ARCHDUKE'S EARNINGS.

Among the bequests of the Archduke Joseph is his son is "the only florin I ever really earned. It hangs in a gold-rimmed tortoise-shell frame above my desk at Budapest." The archduke earned it at Flume by showing a French engineer from Creuzot over the gardens and greenhouses of his place there. This person had rung at a private gate, which the archduke opened, and, thinking the latter a steward's assistant or a gardener, asked him to take him round, he understanding that strangers were admitted to see the grounds. Archduke Joseph rather enjoyed the mistake, and said he would be very pleased. He talked in a plain, blunt manner, and seemed so little the man of consequence that the visitor, on leaving, presented him with a florin for the trouble he had been at. The day after he met by appointment his Imperial Highness, who wanted to order some trolleys at Creuzot. The engineer had the presence of mind not to recognize in the archduke the man who had shown him over the place. As he was leaving, Joseph took the florin out of his waistcoat pocket, and said: "I intend to leave that coin, which perhaps you remember to have seen, as an heirloom to my family," and stated his reason. "The Archduke Joseph's last thought was of the hospital for crippled children that he and the archduchess, his wife, founded.—Paris Letter, London Times.

BILLY ROCHE TO OFFICIATE

Fight Trust Names Him as Referee of the Coming Neil-Tenny Fistic Meeting

Billy Roche will referee the twenty-round fight in Mechanics' Pavilion on Wednesday night between Frankie Neil and Harry Tenny, although the members of the fight trust are not boasting about it. Roche has not acted as referee in this city since his appearance in the ring at the Britt-Nelson affair in Mechanics' Pavilion in December, 1904. Both Neil and Tenny have rounded into the best possible condition. The former did his last boxing on Thursday, when he surprised the spectators with his speed and his hitting ability. He worked in the gymnasium at Croll's Gardens for nearly an hour yesterday on the punching bag and other apparatus. He seemed full of vitality and nervous energy. Tenny marked the last day of his hardy training at Larkspur by knocking out Tom Burke, one of his sparring mates, in the third round. Tenny also boxed three rounds each with Al Emmick and Mark Shaughnessy. Neil weighed 117½ pounds yesterday. The boxers are to weigh 120 pounds at ringside. There will be but little difference between them on Wednesday night. Neil's seconds will be Spider Kelly, Tim McGrath, Johnny Frayne and Martin Frayne. He is at present a 7 to 10 choice in the betting. The meeting of the fight trust tonight is expected to be a lively one. Jim Neil will be present to demand the shares of stock promised him. The trust could make money by having its meeting in a hall where an admission fee could be charged. Porter Ashe and other friends of Neil would be glad to pay for the chance of attending. The South Australian Jockey Club and the Adelaide Racing Club have been urged the government to assist in suppressing bookmaking and in excluding bookmakers from all race courses.
