RARE PORTRAIT OF BONAPARTE

Painting of Napoleon by Gerard in Home of Colonel Alberger in This City.



Portrait of Napoleon Bonaparte painted by Gerard, which was brought to this country from France in 1815 and is now owned by a resident of this city.

A portrait of Napoleon Bonaparte, painted by Gerard, is one of the treasures of a San Francisco household. The picture is the property of Colonel Alberger, who bought it in New York in 1859, and is in perfect condition, the colors retaining the vividness and strength they had when first applied.

None can look at the portrait without being convinced that only a master hand could have painted it. The living, speaking image of the conqueror of Europe stands out from the canvas like a being endowed with life.

Colonel Alberger purchased the portrait in 1859 from a painter in New York, who bought it in 1845 or 1846 at an auction of the effects of a French family which had emigrated to America in 1815, soon after Napoleon's last abdication.

The name was Ducacbet, and the head of the family was supposed to have been an officer of the Emperor's household.

All the artists who have seen the portrait concede it to be one of Gerard's and one of that artist's best.

CARISLE, Pa., March 29.—Wilson Charles, the famous Oneida Indian baseball pitcher, football player and all-around athlete, was married at the Indian school here this evening to Miss Elizabeth Knudsen, a comely Indian maiden.

Nearly 1200 Indian braves and maidens, representing nearly ninety tribes and speaking nearly 100 dialects and tongues, together with several hundred invited guests, filled the school's spacious auditorium, which has lately been transformed into a modern theater.

To the strains of the Tamhauser wedding march Miss Knudsen's wedding party reached the stage in the rear of the room in the following order: Rose Macfarland, Klamath, Cal.; Minnie Rice, Uintah, Utah; Bertha Denis, Seneca, N. Y.; Stacey Beck, Cherokee, Ga.; Mary Ruppelle, San Poli, Wash.; Josephine Charles, Oneida, Wis. bridesmaids; Mrs. Siciel Noni, Okanagon, Wash., matron of honor; Miss Elizabeth Knudsen, the prospective bride, on the arm of Major W. A. Mercer, Eleventh United States Cavalry, who wore the regular army cavalry dress uniform.
