

# SHOT DOWN BY OUTLAW IN OREGON

## Two Members of Posse Are Killed by a Desperado.

## Slayer of a Policeman Escapes From His Pursuers.

## Brave Officers Meet Their Death in Battle in Woods.

PORTLAND, April 28.—A special to the Oregonian from Woodburn, Or., says that Frank Smith, the alleged murderer of Policeman Hanlon of Oregon City, was attacked by the posse which had surrounded him in a clump of brush near that place shortly after 1 o'clock this morning. Smith fired upon his pursuers, shooting Sheriff Shaver of Clackamas County through the stomach and also wounding Captain Henderson, a member of the posse. In the darkness Smith escaped, slipping through the cordons which had been thrown around him and which it was believed was sure to effect his capture. Plans had been laid to capture him at daylight, but at 1 o'clock Sheriff Shaver ordered the posse to rush Smith. Not a shot was fired until they were close upon the man lying hidden in the deep brush.

Then a volley was fired by the posse and, evidently taking aim at Shaver from the flash of his gun, Smith began to shoot. His bullets went true to the mark and Shaver fell almost at the first shot, to be followed a moment later by Henderson. The failure to get Smith when his capture was practically certain gives Smith more than even chance of eluding his pursuers.

Smith is a desperate man, according to the Portland police. He made a dare-devil escape from the City Jail Monday by climbing hand-over-hand along a telephone wire to the fire escape on a building about fifty feet away.

Wednesday morning after Hanlon was murdered a hat which the police identified as Smith's was found close to the scene of the crime. Since then he has led a posse a chase similar to the famous Tracy and Merrill pursuit.

### WIFE SLAYER MAY HAVE FLED TO LOS ANGELES

### Harvard Instructor Suspected of Killing Spouse Believed to Be in Southern City.

CAMBRIDGE, April 28.—Telegrams received today from the Chicago police were to the effect that Erich Muentzer, the instructor at Harvard University, wanted on the charge of murdering his wife, had left that city and that there seemed to be no indications as to where he had gone. It was commonly understood, however, among Muentzer's friends that he intended to return to Cambridge. The authorities and college officials seem greatly mystified over the case, as Muentzer had an excellent reputation. No motive has appeared for the alleged crime.

The woman's death occurred not many days after the birth of a child. CHICAGO, April 28.—Detectives detailed on the Muentzer case reported today that evidence had been secured which would seem to indicate that Muentzer had left Chicago, probably for Los Angeles.

Circumstances have come to light which tend to show that Muentzer was not at all times in full possession of his mental faculties. Bertha C. Muentzer, a teacher in the public schools, was questioned today, as it is believed she may know the whereabouts of her brother.

### SAN FRANCISCO CHINESE REFUGEES WELL TREATED

WASHINGTON, April 28.—Advices received at the Chinese legation in this city from the Chinese Consul General in San Francisco indicate that every consideration is being shown the Chinese refugees and the troops are giving them adequate protection. "The reports from our officials are very gratifying," said Sir Chentung Liang Cheng, the Chinese Minister. "We are grateful at the attention our people are receiving."

In the absence of proper authority for supplies purchased or confiscated, get the certificates or sworn statements from reliable parties as to the value of stock taken, the time of taking, and the party or parties who took the supplies in question.
