CHARLES L. SPIER DECLARED SUICIDE BY CORONER'S JURY Confidential Agent of H. H. Rogers Not Killed by Burglar in His Home. NEW YORK, May 23.—A verdict of suicide was rendered tonight by the jury in the inquest into the death by a pistol shot wound of Charles L. Spier at his home at St. George, Staten Island, on the morning of Monday, May 21. Spier, who was a prominent representative of H. H. Rogers of the Standard Oil Company, was found by the coroner's jury to have committed suicide through the head in the hallway of his house, a few minutes after he had aroused her from sleep to tell her that a burglar was in the house, and taking his pistol, had gone down stairs. One chamber of his pistol, which was found beside the body, had been discharged. In the dining room opening into the hall a quantity of silverware was scattered over the floor, and little doubt was entertained that the burglar had met his death at the hands of a burglar. The police, however, after examining the premises, inclined to the theory that Spier had committed suicide, and later it was reported that he had lost the contents of his pocket watch, which he had temporarily deposited as collateral with his bankers securities entrusted to him by Rogers.
