

MANUAL TRAINING SCHOOLS ARE TO BE OPENED UP AGAIN

Board of Education Grants Leaves of Absence to Teachers.

The directors of the Board of Education at their meeting yesterday decided to reopen the manual training schools that have been left intact and to appoint the teachers in order of their seniority. The following teachers were granted leaves of absence: Miss Rachel Meyer from the school at the corner of the fall term of 1907; Miss Georgiana G. Hawkins from July 23, 1906, to the beginning of the fall term of 1907; Miss Alice N. Martin from July 23 to opening of the fall term of 1907.

SAN ANSELMO, June 28.—Rev. William Alexander, D. D., LL.D., professor of church history in the Presbyterian Theological Seminary, died at his home here today. Dr. Alexander will be sorely missed by a very wide circle of friends and acquaintances. The record of scholars will miss him, for he was a scholar of most unusual breadth of culture. The Presbyterian church loses one of its recognized leaders and most honored servants.

Dr. Alexander was the founder and president of the City College, which San Franciscans of former days remember well. He was also a member of the original faculty of the San Francisco Theological Seminary. He was born in Pennsylvania in 1831. He graduated from Jefferson College in 1858 and from Princeton Theological Seminary in 1861. During his last year in the Princeton Theological Seminary he became quite popular as a platform speaker. Before coming to San Francisco in 1871 to become president of the City College Dr. Alexander was pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of San Jose.

PASSING OF A PIONEER.

NATURALIZATION PAPERS WILL BE INVESTIGATED

NEW YORK, June 28.—An investigation is now being made into naturalization of all naturalized members of the New York police force. Any whose papers are fraudulent will not only be dismissed, it is understood, but will be prosecuted by the United States authorities.

The investigation is expected to result in a sensational shake-up in the Police Department, as the naturalized men on the force constitute 88 per cent of it. Some frauds already have been discovered.
