WELLINGTON GREGG JR. WINS AS GRANTEE OF COPPER KING
Daily and Associates Let the Case Go by Default in United States Circuit Court
Judgment by default was rendered yesterday by Judge Whitson in the United States Circuit Court in favor of Wellington Gregg Jr. in the suit of William H. Daily and the Pacific Coast Smelting and Refining Company vs. Christopher Furness, Frank P. Deering, the Copper King, Limited, and Wellington Gregg Jr. A decree was entered to the effect that the deeds signed and acknowledged by Daily on February 13, 1900, and May 25, 1900, were valid and did convey to the Copper King, Limited, the title to all the lands therein described, and recognizing Gregg as grantee of the Copper King and as the owner in fee simple absolute of those lands.
