THE JAPANESE... Pupil Will Try to Enter School, Alleging Rights by Treaty With Empire TO BE BASIS OF SUIT

At a conference between the School Board and United States Attorney Robert T. Devlin yesterday it was arranged that the foundation for one of the suits to be brought in settlement of the Japanese school question should be laid today.

The issue having thus been formally declared and determined on the doormat of the Redding Primary, the Attorney General, in the name of the President and through Attorney Devlin, will be ready to present the case in the Federal courts for trial.

In its initial step this case, which involves an international dispute and the interpretation of an international treaty, takes the form of an amicable suit in which both parties have the same objectives in advance.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 16.—In discussing the right of the Government to enforce treaties made by this Government and a foreign Government, Representative Foster of Vermont today, while the House was considering the bill, took pronounced ground in support of the President's contention that the Government should see to it that the treaty between the United States and Japan is rigidly observed.

"The constitution," said Foster, "confers upon the national Government the treaty-making power without qualifying words, and provides that all treaties made under the authority there is in the United States shall be a part of the supreme law of the land."

He said he would spend no time on the academic question whether the treaty-making power is granted in sovereignty, because it was his belief that whatever theory is known the power of the Federal Government is the same.

Foster would not say whether there was contained expressly or impliedly in the treaty with Japan a clause that we would have to provide schools for the Japanese in our midst.
