### PLAN TO DISAGREE SENATE FAVORABLE

### Amendment Is to Go Back for Another Step in Joint Action

### SACRAMENTO, Feb. 21.—The Senate and Assembly will take up the work of adjusting their differences on the Held-Wright direct primary constitutional amendment tomorrow morning, when the conference committee appointed on the hardly secured joint rules will meet and agree to disagree.

### The Assembly spent the major portion of its two sessions today squabbling over direct primary legislation, to the end that the morning session resulted in the appointment of conferees on the Held-Wright amendment and the afternoon session, equally stormy, resulted in the passage of the elections committee's substitute for the Stetson bill, which provides a composite of the Illinois and Texas primary election laws.

### OPINIONS DIFFER LITTLE

### There is apparently little difference of opinion between the members of the conference committee, but a strict construction of the rules leaves no room for concession or concurrence to be agreed upon or a report of failure to agree.
