British Ship Monkbarns, With Grain From Here, Is Reported Ashore

According to a cablegram received yesterday at the Merchants' Exchange from London, the British ship Monkbarns, from this port for Antwerp, is ashore at Rammekeas.

The Monkbarns is well known in this port, which she frequently has visited. She left here on December 5 with a cargo of grain. If she should be lost an adverse fate has overtaken her very near the end of her voyage, for on March 19 she was reported having passed Beachy Head, all well. She is commanded by Captain Gough.


