Copper and Gold Finds Are in Many Places

Two large discoveries of ore in Sierra County are reported. The first of these is in a newly opened claim known as the Kitty McCoy in the Allegheny district, where a streak of pay ore has been uncovered by W. J. Seymour when but twenty-five feet of tunnel had been driven. The other is in the mine of the Fruitvale Mining Company, on the north slope of the Middle Yuba. A pocket of gold that realized \$20,000 was taken out, according to current reports. Since then development work has been carried on steadily and the ledge is increasing in width and in sulphur values with depth.

A rich strike is reported in the western part of Siskiyou County in the Blue Lake section near the mine of Elliott Creek, northwest of Garrison Springs. Rich copper ore has also been found on Doolittle Creek, near Happy Camp, on the Klamath River.

The Courier-Free Press makes the following statement concerning a discovery near Hornbrook: One of the greatest mining extensions that has ever taken place in this section is now in progress at a new gold mine near Hornbrook. The center of attraction is the claim of Charles Moss and Lew Love, who are taking out specimens and making the ledge. It is believed that there will be a new Goldfield. Since locating their claim about one week ago they have worked the ledge and have uncovered more than 100 tons of ore. Their efforts were rewarded, but they kept their work quiet as possible, not wanting to attract attention. The ledge is about 100 feet long and 10 feet wide, and is covered about one foot of ore, and has taken out a ton of specimen rock. People are looking to the west for the reported ledge in the Nevada fields.

COPPER LEDGE IN KERN

A rich copper strike has been made in the Caliente canyon in Kern County, near the old mine of the American mine. A vein of lead ore extends in the direction of the Copper Basin country, which has been regarded as a low-grade proposition and has not been worked to any extent. Recently it was discovered by the Hart Brothers and H. Phillips that under the unpromising lead was a vein of rich copper ore, from three to twenty feet thick. Fifty claims have been located along the course of the vein by the Los Angeles men, who may develop the property.

OFFICIAL REPORTING OF YACHTING SEASON

Fleet Leaves Its Winter Quarters in Lagoon Near Tiburon

There was joy at the home of the Corinthian Yacht Club at Tiburon yesterday, for the drawbridge that had held the yachts in winter quarters was successfully raised. On the previous Sunday an attempt had been made to raise the bridge, but the tackle could not stand the strain, and before another could be procured the tide had turned.

The yacht owners who had yachts in the lagoon went across the bay on Saturday night and put up aboard the yachts and at the oar, for the raising of the bridge was accomplished at 6 o'clock in the morning. Just as the sun came up over the eastern hills the crews went to the bridge and fastened the hauling tackle. After much hard pulling the draw gave way to the right, and there was a clear passage into the open water.

The first of the yachts was sent through before 7 o'clock. In a short time twenty yachts and one ark had been cleared. Then the bridge was lowered and the unofficial opening of the yachting season for 1907 had gone into history.

There was a scattering of the fleet. Some went to their moorings off the clubhouse, while others went to their summer berths at Sausalito and other places around the bay. The Harpoon got under way and proceeded to South San Francisco, where it will go on the ways to have its underbody thoroughly overhauled.

Among the yachts that passed through the bridge were: The Emma, Frolic, Truant, Discovery, Mignon, Harpoon, Neptune, Neva and Meteor.
