WASHINGTON, April 10.—The President has appointed Ralph W. Tyler, a negro of Columbus, O., to be auditor of the treasury of the Navy Department.

The question of giving Tyler a Federal office has been under consideration by the President practically all winter. He is one of the two colored men whom the President originally had in mind for some Federal office in Ohio.

DEATH IS THREATENING 20,000,000 RUSSIANS

LONDON, April 10.—Dr. Kennard, commissioner of the Society of Friends, who was sent to investigate the Russian famine, writing from Samara, in the heart of the famine district, under date of April 3, appeals to the United States and Great Britain to send help promptly.

There are 20,000,000 people distributed in the southern provinces of Russia, who, without aid, cannot live to see another harvest. In Samara alone thousands are dying and 750,000 are getting relief of one meal in twenty-four hours.

RUSSIAN HOUSE DEFIES EFFORTS OF STOLYPIN

ST. PETERSBURG, April 10.—Premier Stolypin's efforts to limit the commonplace of the lower house of Parliament by forbidding its committees to obtain statistics from the Zemstvos and avail themselves of outside expert advice, has been defied by the House.

President Golovin has written a curt letter to the premier asking him on what grounds and under what law he is entitled to address such demands to the Imperial Parliament.
