


Sports Squires, the Australian, Creates Favorable Impression

Fighter Is on the Small Order, Rapid Water Shoulders Heavy Impost and Wins but Is Compactly Built



Bill Squires, the heavy weight boxing champion of Australia, came ashore from the liner Ventura yesterday and was overwhelmed by the warmth of the reception accorded him by the great crowd which thronged Pacific street wharf. Batteries of cameras were pointed at him and he bids fair to be as frequently photographed as any great public official or stage beauty.

Squires was born in June, 1878, and never had a boxing lesson until well into his twenty-third year. In the five years in which he has been fighting he has been engaged in twenty-one ring battles and has never met defeat. One fight he won on a foul, but in the majority of them he knocked out his man in short order. In his last six fights he stopped his opponents in the following summary manner: Tom Fennessy, four rounds; Karnick, two rounds; Murphy, three rounds; Ed Williams, 40 seconds; Bill Smith, 1 minute; Mike Williams, champion of South Africa, 35 seconds.

Handling his severe impost of 125 pounds in the feather S. C. Hildreth's Rapid Water scored an impressive victory in the Aschula handicap, at a mile and fifty yards, at Emeryville yesterday. It was Rapid Water's seventh win of the season and was achieved in good racehorse fashion. The horse was one of the heaviest played favorites of the day.

Rubric was the medium of a misguided plunge that sent him to the post favorite in the fifth. He cut no figure in the running. Bedford, the opening favorite, scored an easy victory after Sir Brillar had failed to make a runaway race for the place.
