They are Miss Blanche Cassaboom of Salinas, Miss Cecile Nichols of Sacramento, Miss Olive Dillon, recently of Hanford, now of Fresno, Miss Anna Mrowzinski, also of Fresno, and Miss Ellen Wood of Chula Vista, San Diego county.

Miss Cecile Nichols is known as one of the most popular as well as the most beautiful young women of Sacramento. She is a native daughter, having been born and raised in that city, where she has spent practically all of her life. She is the daughter of F. C. Nichols, who resides at 2113 M street.

Miss Nichols was educated in the public schools and since her graduation has been one of the most popular members of the younger social set.
