Harbor Board Receives Estimates for Another Section of Seawall

The state board of harbor commissioners held its regular meeting yesterday afternoon. Little business came before the board and the session was brief. Chief Engineer Norton submitted to the board his estimate of the cost of constructing 1,000 feet of seawall from the south line of Twenty-third street to the south line of Twenty-sixth street. Norton figures that the work will cost \$364,548, and his estimate was filed until such time as the board is ready to go ahead with the undertaking.

A Standard oil company made application for the exclusive use of a berth southeast of Mason street, to be used for receiving and delivering fuel oil to vessels. The board decided to investigate before making the assignment.

A further communication was received from P. F. Dundon, who a few weeks ago charged Chief Engineer Norton with having manipulated specifications so that nobody but the H. H. Hood Co. could get the contract for supplying a certain lot of creosoted piles. Dundon took exception to the opinion rendered by Attorney Davis at a previous meeting and cited other instances in which, he alleged, Norton had discriminated against his firm and other contractors that the H. H. Hood Co. might be favored.
