this week the Goldfield newspapers are
pouring hot shot into the ranks of
those who have been accused by President
Ruggles of the San Francisco
stock and exchange board of taking
unfair means to bear the market. The
Goldfield Tribune says that a system
is in vogue at Goldfield similar to
that described by President Ruggles as
being in force in San Francisco, an
example of what has taken place the
Goldfield Tribune says:

exchanges sold over a hundred thousand shares
of this stock on one day. The market

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
