Abusive language and jeers from the sidewalk and a few isolated instances of obstruction were the only disturbances in the streetcar situation yesterday.

The United Railroads has asked the police for protection only until 5:30 at night and no cars were run after that hour.

A Twenty-eighth and Valencia street car at noon yesterday was obstructed at Market and Polk streets by a heap of basalt block that had been dumped on the track from a wagon.

The driver of the wagon turned and laughed at the motorman as he drove away, leaving the carmen to lift the heavy blocks off the track.

John J. Rooney refused to arrest the driver. A number of sand wagons continuously obstructed the traffic at the lower end of Ellis street.

Several arrests were made during the day for vile language. These offenses were almost all committed in the Mission.

ACCUSED MOTORMAN MAY BE VICTIM OF FOUL PLAY

The police are trying to determine whether Philip Landau, a strike breaker, was the victim of foul play when he was arrested by police officers.

Landau was one of the motormen on the cars that were operated in Turk street on the afternoon of May 7, when several persons were shot.

Landau was arrested by police officers on the evidence of two men. He was released on \$1,000 cash bail.

Attorney T. M. O'Connor, representing the United Railroads, appeared before Judge Weller yesterday and said that Landau had either been foully dealt with or had absented himself from the state.

"We are in no danger of lacking an adequate working force," said Calhoun. "All that the public demands of us is to be supplied easily. There are plenty of competent and experienced men who are only too willing to work for the United Railroads."

Secretary J. H. Bowling of the carmen's union made an altogether different view of the matter and declared that the desertions of the strike breakers marked the beginning of the end of Calhoun's struggle against organized labor.

"Besides getting shy of cars," he said, "the United Railroads is losing its imported motormen and conductors by the hundreds. These men quit because they were put on runs where passengers were so few that there was no chance of 'nickle grabbing'."

The judge ordered a bench warrant issued for Landau's arrest and detectives are trying to solve the mystery.

FEDERAL JURY INDICTS COAST FURNITURE TRUST

One Hundred and Eighty Dealers Are Named as Defendants

CONSPIRACY CHARGED

Alleged to Have Combined for the Regulation of Prices

PORTLAND, June 5.—In the district court of the United States indictments were returned today against 180 furniture dealers in Oregon, Washington, Idaho and California for alleged violation of the Sherman antitrust law.

The list includes nearly every manufacturer and jobber in the states named and a large number of retail dealers.

The indictments involve the members of the Oregon Retail Furniture Dealers' association, the Northwest Furniture exchange, the Northwest Furniture Dealers' Protective association, the Portland Retail Furniture association and the Lewiston, Idaho, Furniture club and individual members of the California Retail Furniture Dealers' association.

Assistant United States Attorney James Cole announced that he would give the defendants an opportunity to come in and plead voluntarily, but that in the event of their failure to do so bench warrants would be served. No bonds were required.

Produces a Chicken That Can Talk

SAN JOSE, June 5.—After 10 years of experimenting Clinton H. Willis, a rancher on the Monterey road, has produced a chicken that can talk.

The fowl is the sixth generation of a cross between a parrot and a guinea hen, but in every characteristic except the lower half of its bill and the arrangement of its toes the bird is a chicken.

The upper half of the bill is straight like that of the guinea hen, while the lower part is clearly a parrot beak. Its toes are arranged two and two instead of three and one as in the barnyard fowl.

At present the chicken's vocabulary is limited to "Morning, Clint," "Chaw terbaker, Clint," and a three syllabled swear word. The existence of the strange hybrid was learned this afternoon by the visit to San Jose of J. H. Middleton, a dime museum proprietor of Clatskanie, Ore., who offered \$200 for the fowl.

Willis refused the offer, as he will try to improve the breed and wishes to be known as the Burbank of the bird tribe.

CHINESE REBELS ATTACK THE CITY OF WEICHOW

American Cruiser Cleveland Joins Gunboat Helena at Amoy

HONGKONG, June 5.—A serious rebellious outbreak is reported to have occurred at Weichow, about 30 miles south of Pakhoi, formerly the refuge of the pirates of the gulf of Tonkin.

A mob of rebels is attacking the city and troops from Canton have been asked for. The rising at Lienchow is dying out, owing to the energetic action of the local authorities.

AMOI, China, June 5.—Telegraphic communication with Changchow, 40 miles up the river from here, is interrupted and river navigation is suspended, the latter, however, owing to the increased duties levied on vessels and cargoes. The local conditions at Changchow yesterday were reported to be favorable.

WASHINGTON, June 5.—The navy department is informed that the cruiser Cleveland has joined the gunboat Helena at Amoy. It is stated that the movement was not ordered from Washington and that it probably has no more significance than the mere stoppage of the Cleveland at Amoy on her way to another port.

Nothing has been heard from the commander of the Helena regarding the trouble in China and the impression prevails here that the reported rising is confined to the interior and is directed against the government and not against foreigners.

It is not regarded as improbable that the Cleveland will remain at Amoy to assist the Helena in the protection of American interests in case of necessity.
