REPORT WESTERN PACIFIC MAKES GREAT OIL DEAL Operators Say That Railroad Has Purchased Several Million Barrels

PRODUCERS ORGANIZE FUNDS FOR FIREMEN Leading Men of Coalinga District Join Hands for Better Prices

A story is current that the Western Pacific railroad has entered the local field as a lively bidder for California petroleum for fuel. It is reported that a contract has been entered into between the company and A. H. Blodgett, to run five years, based on a price of 41 cents a barrel at the wells, for a great amount of oil, running into the millions of barrels.
