SAN FRANCISCANS SHOW CONFIDENCE IN BANKS

Little Money Withdrawn to Invest in Government's New Issue

APPLICANTS ARE FEW

Ask for Total of \$39,550 of the Certificates of Indebtedness

Fifteen persons made application at the subtreasury yesterday for the new 3 per cent government certificates of indebtedness, to the amount of \$22,050. With Tuesday's subscriptions the total reaches 32 applicants for a total of \$29,550.

San Franciscans have not sought the new certificates as eagerly as the residents of some of the eastern cities, and the explanation is offered that the local public has faith in the banks and is content to leave its money with these institutions.

The sale of certificates, according to local bankers, has tended greatly to restore confidence. Deposits in the banks are rapidly returning to normal.

At a meeting of the savings bank association to consider the situation all reports were so favorable that no action of any sort was taken.

HENRY BRUNNER'S PLAN FOR A CENTRAL BANK San Franciscan Submits Project to President Roosevelt

Henry Brunner, the San Francisco banker, has submitted to President Roosevelt a plan for a central bank which differs in some respects from the suggestion of Frank B. Anderson.

I would amend the national banking act by creating a national bank with an authorized capital of \$200,000,000, divided into 2,000,000 shares of \$100 each.

First, to act as the financial agent of the United States and to issue bank notes payable at the discretion of the board of directors of the bank or upon a resolution of congress.

Second, to issue bank notes against deposits of United States legal tender.

THIRD, to reduce commercial paper from any national bank which is a share holder, to the amount of \$100,000.

FOURTH, to grant loans out of the surplus that is not needed for rediscout on bonds approved by the board of directors of the bank and the controller of the currency.

OAKLAND MERCHANTS OPPOSE Plan to Consolidate Cities Will Discuss the Project Today at Luncheon of the Exchange

OAKLAND, Nov. 20.—The directors of the merchants' exchange do not approve of the project originated in San Francisco to consolidate the bay cities into one great metropolis.

Some of the views of directors of the merchants' exchange on the proposed merging of the bay cities follow:

A. JOHNS—As a merchant I am opposed to consolidating with San Francisco. While it is true that we have many interests in common our locations are different and Oakland and San Francisco do not bear the same relation to each other that New York and Brooklyn do.

FRED SINCLEAR—To me the consolidation of Oakland and San Francisco would be absurd and we on this side of the bay would gain nothing by merging and would lose our identity.
