Physicians Report His Demise Due to Natural Causes

SPECIAL DISPATCH TO THE CALL STOCKTON, Nov. 26.—After several attempts to arouse Harry D. Norris of San Francisco, Berkeley, in the Yosemite hotel in this city late this afternoon, one of the hotel clerks broke into the room and found Norris dead on his bed.

Physicians effects show that he was employed as a civil engineer in San Joaquin county. Data and memoranda indicate that he was engaged in making a preliminary survey of a route between Stockton and the Yosemite valley.

An autopsy held tonight revealed that death was due to natural causes. Norris was about 35 years of age.

Eighty-four hours Going Back to Orient on Hongkong Maru

The Japanese liner Hongkong Maru, Captain Ernest Best, sailed yesterday for the Orient, heavily laden with general cargo and crowded with passengers.

In the steage, in addition to the usual number of Chinese, brown and yellow, the Hongkong Maru carried 80 Filipinos, who are going back to their native land after several months at the Jamestown exposition. Six tribes were represented in the four score Filipinos, and the captain gathered on the liner's deck. They are all Moros. Three of the tribes are classed when at home as savage. The others are what they call civilized in the far eastern islands.

The troupe of Moros came to this country on the Nippon Maru. Early in the voyage they quarreled with the Japanese steage passengers, and only prompt measures of repression prevented a bloody battle.
