In these lines Lawrence W. Harris, author of the "Dam'dest Finest Ruins," helps in the plea for public support of the auxiliary of infants' shelter, which, being without funds, is in danger of having to discontinue its worthy services to the community.

The aim of the institution is to care for the children of working women while the latter are at their labors. Its old home was destroyed by the fire, and since then it has had to maintain temporary quarters at 2267 Howard street.

But kids somehow need lots of care and a watching constantly. There's lullabies to sing at night—Morning prayers and hymns, and the mother must have the proper things to eat and drink—and naps.
