

Shipping News & Losses of the Water Front Brings Soldiers from Philippines and Bluejackets from Asiatic Station

The United States army transport Buford arrived yesterday morning from the Philippines with five companies of the Second Infantry, 160 casualties and 120 enlisted men and marines from the warships on the Asiatic station.

Charles H. Muir left Manila as a captain attached to the Second Infantry. When he arrived here he found himself a major slated for transfer to another regiment, probably one now on duty in the Philippines.

There was one death on the Buford on the homeward voyage. The victim was Private Nathan Griggs. He died March 29 of pulmonary tuberculosis. The experience of a newly commissioned ensign responsible for an accident while the Buford was lying at Marivales, which might have resulted in a tragedy.
