NEW LONDON, Conn., June 25.—Amid a deafening din of whistles and horns and amid the shouts of collegians the Harvard varsity eight shot their boat over the finish line tonight, winning from the crippled and distanced Yale crew that classic of American college aquatics, the Harvard-Yale varsity boat race.

Up to this unexpected climax it had been a struggle worthy of the best traditions of the old antagonists, and with the fitting setting of a marine spectacle such as has seldom been equaled along a regular course for the distance.
