He denied that he contemplated any immediate financing for Southern Pacific and ridiculed the rumors of any possible control of the St. Louis and San Francisco system, which has been a matter of gossip.

Harriman said that the railroads in the west, especially in the far west, had been very much favored by general conditions, including the good crops and good weather.

Harriman gave an interview in which he went more fully into general conditions. He said there was nothing in the oft repeated rumor of a holding company of western roads. He said that the Southern Pacific properties, and that no immediate financing was contemplated for those lines.

EXPLAINS RISE IN STOCKS

"Why have the stocks of the Union Pacific and Southern Pacific been so exceedingly strong recently?" he was asked. "Because they were weak before," Harriman told with apparent satisfaction. "The reason we are operating at such a high rate is because of our good physical condition."

Harriman said he favored an increase in freight rates, if only to help the weaker roads, which were in a physical state, and could not hope to improve their condition unless they secured better terms.

The people, Harriman said, were getting to feel more favorable to proper railroad management. "The most correct action now is to keep the lines and the farther west you go the more this feeling is emphasized," he said.

"There is just as much of that business as before. The only difference is there is more competition on the water."

The question of ship subsidy was introduced and Harriman said: "I never had a hand in any legislation along these lines."

Harriman justified his purchase of securities in other roads by saying that
